

Public Works Report

Water

- Reminder to citizens to try and conserve outside watering by adjusting outside sprinklers to standard efficiency and to turn off pools, hot tubs, and hoses when not being used

Sewer

- The Headworks project is complete
- Power upgrade to the Lagoons has been approved by PGE and the project will start the end of July
- DEQ has approved our Storm Water TMDL plan

Parks

- Wennerberg Park will be closed Monday July 1st and Tuesday July 2nd for dust abatement

Streets

- Dust abatement is scheduled for July 1st—all gravel streets city-wide and the road through Wennerberg Park will receive road dust treatment

Code Corner



With the beautiful weather the team has been out and about and noticed a few recurring situations that we wanted to bring to the attention of community members:

Parking

- Vehicles must park in the direction they would be proceeding (no “wrong way” parking).
- A vehicle may not be parked in the same place on a public street for more than seventy-two (72) consecutive hours.
- Vehicles may not park in such a way as to impede traffic or obstruct the traffic view or sidewalk.
- RVs, trucks and other large vehicles may not be parked in the right of way in such a way as to obstruct the view.
- No vehicles, trailers or boats are to be parked or stored in the yard areas of private properties

Vegetation

- The accumulation of grass, weeds and other noxious vegetation, living or dead, of an inflammable nature on private property is prohibited
- Grass, weeds and other noxious *vegetation is not to grow more than 10 inches in height
- Trees must be trimmed to the trunk at least eight (8) feet over walks and pedestrian paths, and to a minimum height of fifteen (15) feet over streets and vehicular traffic areas.
- All vegetation must conform to clear vision standards allowing for pedestrians and vehicles to navigate sidewalks and streets safely.
- Property owners shall maintain and keep in repair **planting strips in the public rights-of-way of the city that are in front of, adjacent to, or abutting upon the property

** “Planting strip” means the portion of area between a private property line and the curb or edge of pavement or traveled way which is not improved by a sidewalk.

Out & About



On June 26, 2024, Carlton Police Department responded to a call of a dog being accidentally locked inside a vehicle in the area of Main Street and Kutch Street.
